


How to Remember Your Gallon Equivalents!

Say hello!






The core of this man is the gallon (gal).




He has **arms** and **legs** just like you and me!




Each arm and leg represent a quart.

> ... just like there are **4 quart**ers in **1** dollar!




His **forearms** and **lower legs** are just like ours!... there are two bones there!




There are 2 pints in 1 quart.

There are 8 pints in 1 gallon.




The Gallon Man is all **fingers** and **toes**... **NO** thumbs or big toes!




There are 2 cups in 1 pint.


Big T turned 16 so he can drive the CUP car. His cousin Oz is 8 so he can't drive.




